And for thinking about changes to come.


This will be the last new year's message I make as your First Minister, as this year will signal a change for me personally.

Victoria Hislop's first novel, The Island, held the number one slot in the Sunday Times paperback charts for eight consecutive weeks and has sold over two million copies worldwide. Victoria was the Newcomer of the Year at the 3

Galaxy British Book Awards 2007 and won the Richard & Judy Summer Read competition. Her second novel, The Return, set against the tempestuous backdrop of the Spanish Civil War, was also a number one bestseller. Her latest novel, The Figurine, was published in September 2023. It shines a light on the questionable acquisition of cultural treasures and the price people – and countries – will pay to cling on to them. Victoria was executive producer on the adaptations of her novels The Island, Cartes Postales and One August Night for Greek television – and recently took part in Dancing with the Stars, also on Greek television. Victoria divides her time between England and Greece and, in 2020, was granted honorary citizenship by the President of Greece. She is patron of Knossos 2025, which has raised funds to rebuild the new research centre at one of Greece's most significant archaeological sites, and is also on the British Committee for the Reunification of the Parthenon Marbles.



In May next year, eligible residents will be able to vote in the Police and Crime Commissioner elections.

But what happens if you are unable to get to a polling station to vote? Whatever the reason, you don't need to lose your chance to vote - you can do it by post or by asking someone to be your proxy. Read on to find out more.

Postal voting means that you receive your ballot paper through your letterbox a few weeks before the election. You then cast your vote and put it in the post - no need for a stamp.

You can apply for a postal vote on the Government's website.

If you already have a postal vote, there have been some changes this year. Make sure you visit <u>our electoral webpages</u> to find out what those changes mean for you.

Voting by proxy means that you have given someone else permission to vote on your behalf. There are only a few circumstances when this is allowed, and you should only apply for a person you trust to cast your vote for you.

There is more information about proxy voting on <u>our electoral pages</u> and you are able to apply for someone to be your proxy on the <u>Government's website</u>.

If someone has been your proxy in the past, or if you have acted as a proxy voter for someone else, in the past, there have been some important changes to

the rules. Please have a read through the information on our <u>How to vote</u> <u>page</u> to find out if these changes affect you.

To apply to vote by post, or to elect a proxy, you will need to be registered to vote. You can do this in just a few minutes on the Government's register to vote webpage.

Welsh Councils draw up lists of roads to return to 30mph because 20mph 'doesn't feel right'

Deputy Minister for Climate Change Lee Waters, also said they are considering further tweaks to the guidance for councils on exceptions.

Councils need to apply a 'sniff test' to decide whether a road should stay 20mph in a review of the new default limit. It is now nearly four months since the Welsh Government changed the limit on most 30mph roads in Wales to 20mph.

Deputy climate change minister Lee Waters, the man who has led the way for the government on the new limit, released an update on the planned review into the impact of the limit and what changes could be made. It comes after a massive backlash in Wales from drivers with protests and a petition with almost half a million signatures.

The minister revealed there were vast differences in how local authorities had used 'exceptions'.

These are roads that could be made exempt from 20mph and a 30mph limit retained.

There are some local authorities like Swansea and Bridgend where 10% of roads have stayed at 30mph. But in North Wales there are four councils where it is under 1%. <u>North Wales Live has written a previous piece on this issue.</u>

Self Assessment of Service Statement will go live on 31st January

We will soon be writing to all childcare and play providers about their Self Assessment of Service Statement (SASS) 2024.

What is a SASS?

SASS is an online form that Registered Persons and Responsible Individuals are required to complete. This is a legal requirement for all childminders and childcare and play providers.

What do we do with the data?

The information providers give us through their SASS submission helps us to plan our inspections and provide the right help and support to those who need it most. The data from across Wales will be collated, anonymised and published later in 2024.. Important information for all childcare and play providers: If you run a childcare and play service, you are required to complete

your SASS using CIW Online by 15 March 2024.

If you do not complete your SASS by this date, it will impact your future ratings.

You will need to have a CIW Online account to complete your SASS. If you do not have a CIW Online account, you need to take urgent action:

Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board is the operational name of Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board from us and third parties based on our knowledge of you, of bottom of the form enforcement of the new default 20mph speed limit will begin this month, more than three months after <u>the controversial policy</u> was introduced. There has been confusion around when the new speed limit would be enforced. It was said enforcement would begin three months after the new speed limit was introduced, which would have been 17th December. However the Welsh Government has confirmed enforcement for the speed limit actually begins in January.

"<u>Wales Online understands</u>" that this date will officially begin on Monday, 8th January. Last month, the Welsh Government said: "GoSafe will begin selecting new sites (locations) for speed vans and other enforcement (roads that were 30mph and are now 20mph) once the new speed limit has been in place for three months."

Now that the planning is complete, people can expect to see teams from GoSafe out on the roads this month. In a statement, a Welsh

Government spokesperson said: "Following the introduction of the new default 20mph speed limit in September, 2023, there was an initial bedding-in period to give people time to adapt to the change.
